Minutes Minutes of the meeting of 27th April approved and signed by Chairman, proposed Bill Balfour,

Presentation Liz and Keila gave a presentation on the proposed garden at the back of the Trevelyan Hall

with a display of the plans and samples of some of the materials to be used. They had sought advice on plants, security, lighting etc. The representatives from Dovecot Way were concerned about the proximity to their gardens and what problems could arise. Those present visited the site to get a better idea of the proposed garden. It was felt that generally with co-operation all round the project could be realised. Planning permission is hoped to be granted this year.

Liz and Keila then left the meeting.

Police P.C. Hamilton reported that it was basically very quiet at the moment. The police landrover

had attended the playgroup and been a great success. Concern was felt about the number of cars in the Woodhall Picnic area and asked that people be aware of this. Youths in cars are speeding up the road to the Water Treatment plant at Spilmersford and around the bus stop area also lighting bonfires. He was asked whether the survey of traffic speeds on Beech Terrace had been done but no word on this. General discussion about speed indicators (New Winton

one still not operating) and placing of speed limit signs. P.C.Hamilton then left the meeting.

Bob Rees had spoken to school concerning the community council and felt a joint project i.e. litter collection, could be considered. There had previously been litter campaigns organised by the Community Council. Bob and Nicky to consider for next spring.

Overgrown footpaths – discussion as to whose responsibility.

There is no further news on the proposed picnic site in Winton Estate at the bridge.

general letter suggesting that they would be dealt with in due course.
